About National Seminar

After the downfall of Sikh Kingdom, the British East India Company being apprehensive of valour and power of ex soldiers, adopted the policy of appeasement. Salaries of Sikh soldiers and lands to important chiefs were given. The Princely States were helped in every possible way. The uprising of 1857 (First freedom movement), was very badly crushed with the help of Princely States. Namdhari Movement aimed to revive the Khalsa rule. They socially boycotted goods, postal system and English schools of the British. Suddenly they butchered cow slaughters in Amritsar, Ludhiana, Raikot and Malerkotla because of which sixty six Namdharies were blown up with the canons. Baba Ram Singh was deported to Burma (Myanmar). Peaceful Namdharies are still following their Guru's teachings. Ghadar party came into existence in San Francisco. Its impact remained from 1913-1919. Kartar Singh Sarabha was the youngest martyr. Its plan failed because of the strong British intelligence and Indian informers the movement suffered a big loss of 42 deaths, 114 deported for life. Baba Gurdit Singh Komagata Muru considering British Indians as equal to other Britain's colonies was wrong, which resulted into death of twenty Indians.

Massacre at Amritsar awakened Indians from slumber of slavery. Shaheed Udham Singh revenged it. Bhagat Singh Shaheed, Rajguru and Sukhdev gave clarion call of freedom of India. 379 Indians were killed by the Britishers and thousands were seriously injured.

Gurdawara Reform Movement, Babbar Akalis, Naujawan Bharat Sabha, Kirit Kisan party, Indian National Army, Quit India Movement etc. played major role in freedom movement.

The prominent heroes of this period are Baba Ram Singh, Kartar Singh Sarabha, Bhagat Singh Shaheed, Rajguru, Sukhdev, Lala Lajpat Rai, Lala Har Dyal, Bhai Parmanand, Saifuddin Kitchlew, Shaheed Udham Singh, Madan Lal Dhingra etc.
